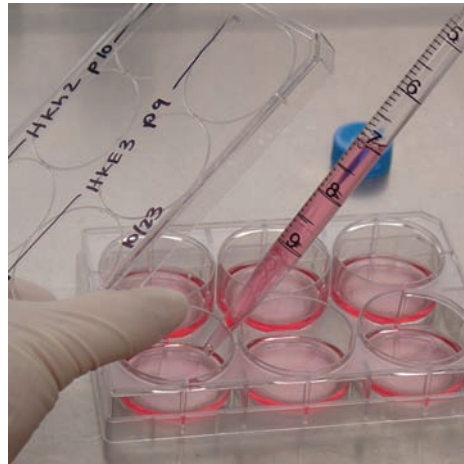

In 2006, the Center celebrated its 30th anniversary as Arizona's premier National Cancer Institute-designated comprehensive cancer center, focusing not only on patient care but also on basic and clinical research, prevention, education, and training.
- The Center's clinical affiliate in Tucson, University Medical Center (UMC), consistently ranks among the top 50 hospitals in the nation for cancer care, according to U.S. News & World Report's Best Hospitals Survey.
- In Jan. 2007, Arizona Cancer Center physicians began seeing patients at UMC's new cancer treatment facility. The Arizona Cancer Center Peter and Paula Fasseas Cancer Clinic at UMC North is approximately 80,000 square feet and is a "one-stop center" where patients receive a variety of support services as well as leading-edge cancer therapies.
- Operates two primary research sites: one at the University of Arizona in Tucson and the other at the Virginia G. Piper Cancer Center in Scottsdale. The Center also has more than a dozen research and educational outreach offices throughout the state.

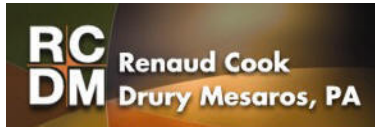

- Plenty of water and green tea are your best beverage choices.
